Stage 1 of the Mosman Remembers Upgrade of The Mosman War Memorial to include the additional 133 names of Mosman's dead in WW1 identified by the late George Franki and placed on the Memorial in gold leaf was completed with the official dedication on Remembrance Day; the cost of approximately \$150,000 being funded totally by The Trust. Stoneplus stonemasons achieved a highly professional result.

Stage 2 of The Mosman Remembers Project to Upgrade The Mosman War Memorial to acknowledge the names of Mosman residents at the time of enlistment for service in WW11, Korea, Malaya, Borneo and Vietnam by commemorating them on plaques/plinths for WW11 and under the respective campaigns for the other conflicts in the Later Conflicts area of The War Memorial Park was approved by Mosman Council in October however, unfortunately Council will not be providing any funding for the project due to budgetary constraints imposed by COVID19. I have submitted an Application for Commonwealth funding for a substantial amount under The Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Programme. The total cost of Stage 2 will be approximately \$250,000. Stoneplus stonemasons have been commissioned to implement this stage of The Project. I am continuing with research for these names and at this stage have in excess of 1130 WW11 names, 20 Korea names, 3 Borneo/ Malaya names and 50 Vietnam names. The names need to be finalised by 31 May 2021 for provision to Stoneplus for inscription.

The Mosman Remembers Literary Award Project for 2020, "Remembering the 75th Anniversary of the End Of WW11" was seriously impeded by COVID19 issues. With 800 brochures printed and letters and follow up emails and telephone calls to over 35 high schools, Mosman Library, Mosman RS Club and on The Trust website, only 2 applications were received. This was a bitterly disappointing result with schools expressing difficulties with COVID19. Whilst the 2 entries received did not strictly comply with the rules, The Trust nevertheless presented both entrants with \$50 book vouchers to be redeemed at The Constant Reader bookshop in Mosman.

During the year The Trust employed a new website maintainer, Retail Labs, to present a more user friendly website. You are encouraged to review the website frequently for any updates and news.
